Group Discussion: How should we as Christians deal with people (especially family members) who mistreat us?

- Surrender your hurt feelings to Lord in prayer handing over all these feelings to Him (I Pet. 5:7).
- Ask the Lord for the grace to forgive those who've hurt you just He has forgiven you (Matt. 6:12).
- Look for opportunities to have an honest conversation to resolve the issues (Matt. 18:15).



 Wait patiently on the Lord, who will righteously to judge every person (Rom. 12:19).

## **Introduction to Genesis**

Author: Traditionally, the author has always been assumed to have been Moses.


Date of Writing: likely 1440 - 1400 B.C.

Purpose of Writing: Genesis introduces core teachings creation, the fall of man, sin, salvation, grace and many more...

### **Practical Application:**

- The overriding theme of Genesis is God's eternal existence and His creation of the world.
- All people, regardless race or nationality, are accountable to the Creator for our sins.
- Through one small nation, Israel, God's redemptive plan is revealed and made available to all - in Christ. We rejoice in that plan.





# Read Genesis 39:1- 6, 16 - 23

- 1. What was Potiphar's relationship to the pharaoh of Egypt?
- A Man of Prominence: He's an Egyptian who has made it to the Palace of the Pharaoh (Good Govt job).
- <u>A Man of Power</u>: He is the captain of the Guard of Pharaoh having authority and people under him.
- A Man with Provision(s): Obviously he is well paid and trusted by Pharaoh.



Note: Even in the most difficult and unfair situations God still has a way to position us with people of influence.

- 2. From what group of people did Potiphar buy Joseph?
- Joseph Was 1<sup>st</sup> Sold Out By His own family members – the people closest to him.
- Joseph Was Sold In To Slavery By his brothers to the Ishmaelites – foreigners for some coins...
- Joseph Was Sold Toward His Destiny Potiphar bought Joseph and into his house and into God's plan.



Note: All things will work for the good – even when they don't look or feel good when we trust in God. (Rom 8:38).

- 3. How do you think Joseph felt being betrayed by his brothers?
- <u>Disappointed</u> Sometimes our greatest troubles come from those closest to us.
- <u>Despair</u> The uncertainty of the future especially slavery in a foreign land.
- <u>Determined</u> To honor, trust and serve God and even to forgive his brothers.



Note: Joseph's life (as well as ours) mirrors the Life of Christ – betrayed by His own people yet He forgave ...(Luke 23:34)

- 4. What is the meaning of the phrase "The Lord was with Joseph (v. 5)?
- <u>God's Presence</u> Even in midst of ungodly people God is still with Joseph.
- God's Protection Although surrounded by people with a different language/culture, Joseph is under God's Protection.
- God's Power and Provision Joseph gets God's favor – even from the very people enslaving Him.

Note: No matter how difficult things get in life – Jesus never ever leaves us.



# 5. How did Potiphar's household receive a blessing because of Joseph?

- God's Favor Touched Joseph: God's Hand of Favor is upon Joseph — even in foreign land.
- <u>Joseph's Favor Touched His Work:</u> God's favor upon Joseph's faithful work makes a difference.
- God's/Joseph's Work Touched Potiphar's House:
   One Godly person can make a difference in Godless society



Note: God's blessings and favor can find us – not matter where we are.

- 6. Do you think Potiphar believed his wife's accusation against Joseph?
- He Responded Angrily: Not wanting to lose Joseph –
  a valuable servant, because of his wife.
- He Responded With Leniency: Normally, a person accused of Rape of an Egyptian official's wife would executed.
- He Responded With Charity: Potiphar places Joseph in a prison with those associated with the King.

Note: God uses the evil decision of others and controls the hearts of leaders – moving them to accomplish His will.



7. List the characteristics Joseph had that helped him to maintain his composure when he was lied about?

# Joseph's Characteristics:

- **Integrity:** Consistent Godly and Moral behavior.
- <u>Faithfulness:</u> Joseph faith in God doesn't change in the good and bad times.
- Trust: Strong trust in God's will and goodness.



• <u>Patience:</u> Wiling to wait on the Lord's timing to make a change in my situation

- 8. How can we continue to trust God at times when it feels like more bad than good is happening to us?
  - <u>Talk to the Lord</u>: Take all of our issues great or small to the Lord in Prayer.
  - Hear From the Lord: Read God's Word to remind ourselves of His Power, Promises and Purposes for us.

 Worship The Lord: Sing Praise to God – by yourself and with others. Stay connected to other believers and to the Church.

# **Keys For Living**

- Being a child of God does not exempt us from facing unfair hardships. However, God will use these troubles for our good and His glory.
- Even in the most difficult times and circumstances, the Lord is always with us even when we may not feel it.



 Just as Jesus forgave from the cross – God will give us the grace to forgive those who have wronged us.
